**Apostleship of the Sea: This Week is Sea Sunday**  
 Fr Colum Kelly, who for 11 years has served as a chaplain at Immingham Docks in Lincolnshire, it sounds as if he doesn't always have the option to wait to be asked to help. On an average day 20 or 30 ships might come through Immingham, as many as 50 on a busy day. Freighters dock here full of coal, consumable goods, biomass, the crews made up of Chinese, Filipino, Russian, Ukranian sailors who have been packed together for weeks and "who know they've docked in the UK somewhere, but generally don't have a clue where they are". Fr Kelly has set himself up, amid the cranes and building-high container stacks, as Immingham's human face. Recently he had to settle a borderline revolution on board a ship when a crew fell out with its employers over contract terms. He has helped with cases of "unpaid wages, bad food, bullying" and says he can only wonder about the unresolved situations on ships he doesn't get a chance to climb aboard. Fr Kelly has been a chaplain at Immingham for over a decade and even on a good day, he explains, it would not be possible for him to see even half the people who might want or need it. There are simply too many ships. "You target where you think you might be most needed."

**The year of Masses invoking the intercession of Blessed John Henry Newman has now ended**  
 At the beginning of this year of prayer, Richard was seriously ill with advanced kidney cancer, the tumours having spread to his lungs. After the removal of the malignant kidney, dark patches on his lungs revealed numerous small growths, a very serious complication. Richard has now had four three-monthly scans of his lungs and the latest one has revealed the tumours have all died and none of them have grown or spread. His condition is now classified as stable and the three-monthly scans have been reduced to four-monthly ones. I believe this is a definite answer to prayer and Richard and Lucy have been deeply touched by the knowledge the Church and so many people have been praying for them. They were particularly moved to hear Blessed John Henry Newman had been praying for them, for this is the man, who 150 years ago, walked almost daily on King's Heath, Birmingham across the road from where they now live, and in whose Oratory Lucy has performed and sung.
